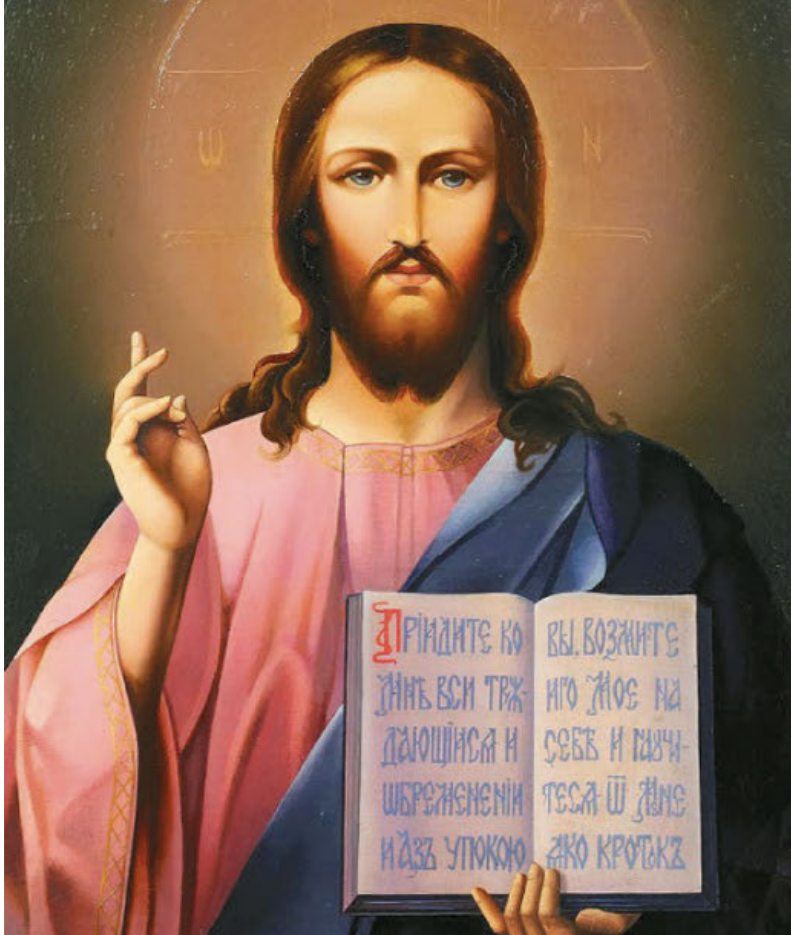

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE May 15, 2022 | 5th Sunday of Easter

“It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God.” Many folks really work very hard to circumvent difficult situations. We prefer the easier way around something, rather than risk inconvenience, hurt or prolonged suffering. It’s no wonder euthanasia is rapidly becoming acceptable around the world. Through purely human eyes, there is no issue bypassing the inevitable, taking control and bringing things more swiftly to a place of peace. If this is the way God sees things, then why does Jesus make such a big deal helping us understand the experience of suffering and embrace it? God’s wisdom clearly takes us in another direction.



Imagine if we were able to eradicate ALL hardship and suffering. Where would we be? As we look at our own journeys, many of our solid more growth producing life lessons have been born of suffering, disappointment, inconvenience, darkness, and despair. There is something sacred about all of these experiences as God uses them to create something new. Envisioning a life without hardship and suffering brings us to a vision where everything is flat-lined and dull. As much as hardship and suffering are difficult crosses to bear, not taking them up runs the risk of us becoming shallow, empty, and lifeless. Helen Keller remarks that, “a happy life consists not in the absence but in the mastery of hardships.” What an incredibly wise insight! Many really successful people and saints were brought to their station in life because they suffered. Suffering teaches us about what’s important and propels us to search the depths of our souls for resources and strength we never would have known before.

This is especially true when we love as Jesus asks us to love. Love, perhaps above any other experience, can cause us great hardship, pain, and suffering especially when it’s authentic and unconditional. While it can thrust us into an incredible experience of God and life on one hand, it can bruise and wound us deeply on the other. Mastering the art of love is the secret to living life well, walking in the presence of God and investing in the joy of the Gospel. Love and suffering walk hand in hand. Compromising one will compromise the other. Maybe that’s why Jesus spent so much time convincing us to accept both.

St. Margaret of Cortona | May 16

Though St. Margaret of Cortona (1247 - 1297) is today known as being an incredibly pious Catholic, she didn't start out that way. Born into a farming family in Laviano, Tuscany, her mother died when St. Margaret was seven. Her father remarried, but life with her stepmother was so difficult that St. Margaret moved out of the home and instead chose to live with a man named Arsenio, though they weren't married. They had been living together for nine years when she gave birth to a son. Knowing in her heart that this wasn't the life that God intended for her to have, she prayed for purity.



One day while waiting for Arsenio, his dog led her into the forest where she found Arsenio murdered. So shocked was St. Margaret that she fell into a life of penance. She and her son returned to Laviano, but still found her stepmother to be as unwelcoming as ever. They then went to Cortona, and eventually her son became a friar.

Three years after her conversion, St. Margaret followed in her son's footsteps and became a Franciscan tertiary. During her life, St. Margaret established a hospital and founded a congregation of tertiary sisters. She was canonized in 1728. @LPi

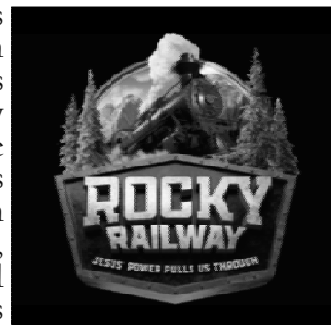

"Father where are you going...?" The small girl shuffled a little and side stepped to stay in pace with her father. "I am going to climb the mountain and see where the lambs live." He did not slow down, but he smiled at her with his eyes.

"Oh father.... please take me with you...." she grabbed his hand into her own and skipped to keep up with his long strides. He stopped then at the base of a rocky narrow hill and crouched down so that he was eye to eye with his little daughter.

"This is not like any mountain you have climbed before..." he said gesturing to the stone path. "Once we begin the road, you must walk all the way to the top with me....do you understand?" The little girl nodded her head and jumped up and down, the way that all six-year-olds do.

"Oh, I understand father...I can do it!" she insisted, "I want to go see the lambs too!" The father got to his feet, and extended his hand. They began to walk together, the path away from the village and the red tiled roofs and fieldstone homes. The mountain village existed as if lost in a time and place from the past. The air still pure and unpolluted from car exhausts and artificial noise that they were used to in their western life, back home.

A distant cow bell jangled, as their footsteps crunched the loose pebble floor. The mountains reached up into the clouds and down into an endless chasm below, but still the road was safe, calm, and unassuming. "How much longer...?" She asked him from time to time. He would answer by extending his hand to help her along, and a smile for reassurance, but he never said a word,

leaving the road boundless with the possibility of finding the lambs around each bend. "I thought they were going to be here..." he said again, with a tenderness on his face, that helped her to understand a little bit. "Are you kidding daddy?" she asked as tears filled her eyes. "I'm sorry.... I..." Then he picked his daughter up and he began to walk down the mountain path. She cried for a little bit, but the path down was faster, and she knew where they would end up and so after just a few minutes she was able to walk again beside her father. The cow's bell jangled a welcome back to the village, and they smiled at each other upon returning from such a journey. They walked now toward the center of the square surprised at finding a group of people standing around an old barn.

"Daddy...!" he heard her shriek and saw her run before he could protect her heart and her eyes. "The lambs...Daddy!" she screamed but they were not as she wanted to find them, and the terror shocked the air. The lambs stood tied up in a row. As the man, pierced a lance through the chosen one, and began to shear the meat. He grabbed for his shrieking daughter and pulled her toward the house. She pushed and ran from his arms as he entered the door. She screamed for her mother.

"Mommy....they killed the lamb!" she sobbed uncontrollably and looked at her mother's face.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist

"Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." John 1:29-34 The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me. I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.'" And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

"The Lamb who takes away the sin of the world"

CCC608 After agreeing to baptize him along with the sinners, John the Baptist looked at Jesus and pointed him out as the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world".422 By doing so, he reveals that Jesus is at the same time the suffering Servant who silently allows himself to be led to the slaughter and who bears the sin of the multitudes, and also the Paschal Lamb, the symbol of Israel's redemption at the first Passover.423 Christ's whole life expresses his mission: "to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."424

In my vision, I heard the sound of an immense number of angels gathered round the throne and the living creatures and the elders; there were ten thousand times ten thousand of them and thousands upon thousands, loudly chanting: **Worthy is the Lamb that was sacrificed to receive power, riches, wisdom, strength, honour, glory and blessing.** Then I heard all the living things in creation -- everything that lives in heaven, and on earth, and under the earth, and in the sea, crying: To the One seated on the throne and to the Lamb, be all praise, honour, glory and power, for ever and ever. And the four living creatures said, 'Amen'; and the elders prostrated themselves to worship. Rev 5:11-10

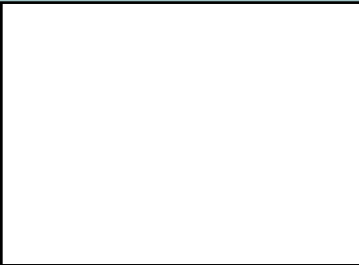
